Great news about a monk your love has supported! Mexico: Fr. Nektariy receives a prestigious award



Fr Nektariy is honored with the Tlahuicole Award

Holy Trinity Monastery in Mexico has helped dozens of families who became refugees during the Ukrainian crisis. Through our connections with UNHCR and RC/CARITAS, Fr. Nektariy has managed to help an uncounted number of refugees from Russia in the past two years to legally immigrate to the U.S. or legally stay in Mexico.

All these things have been fully accomplished through the work of the Holy Trinity monastic community – and **with your help**. If you've been following Fr. Nektariy's life through our newsletters, you know that he and the other monastics support the monastery by working multiple jobs. They offer care and comfort to all who approach them. They teach, translate Orthodox literature into Spanish, and lead people to find the light of Christ.

The monks' life is not easy. Fr. Nektariy suffers from several serious health concerns, and the economic situation in Mexico is often unstable, making it difficult to achieve self-sufficiency without at least some outside help... But, worst of all, there are those who desperately hate the kind, mild, godly monks who spend their life in prayer...

As with most missions, good news from Mexico means that they are alive and continuing their work to the glory of the Lord.

How you saved the ROCOR mission in Korea

Your timely compassion ensured the survival of Orthodoxy in the Land of the Morning Calm

Last July, Fr. Paul Kang, the head of the tiny (and very interesting!) mission in Okgye-dong, South Korea, contacted the Fund for Assistance, because things were desperate.

The landlord of the parish property (ROCOR really needs to buy its own properties, don't you think?) came into the church yelling, poking Fr. Paul in the chest with his finger, and demanding his money RIGHT NOW.

\$10,000 now, or he'll change the locks and the parish would lose their prayer space.

For years, the tiny mission in South Korea had been self-sufficient, **funded by its own clergy.**

Seeing how difficult poverty was for the mission and for his father, who was the priest at the time, the current head of the mission, Fr. Paul Kang got a Ph.D. in Physics, and became a successful entrepreneur. Fr. Paul (mostly) single-handedly supported the work of the mission, as well as book translation and publication for several years.

But his business went bankrupt and – since he was supporting it on his own dime – so did the mission.

Metropolitan Nicholas himself asked that FFA help the Korean Orthodox Mission survive...

You answered and the money was collected in just FIVE days, allowing Fr. Paul to pay the rent and have some money left over!

News from Haiti is still disturbing... Shooting, looting, and so much suffering...



Our mission is surviving as best it can. Normal life has come to a screeching halt. Unemployment, grinding poverty, hunger, inflation, and violence are old news.

As Matushka Rose Legouté wrote, "the mission celebrated Holy Nativity with joy in their hearts and a hope for a return to order."

Sadly, their annual Nativity festal lunch, for which the clergy and faithful used to gather for years, had to be cancelled.

In your charity, please pray for the mission in Haiti. Things are bad. And they desperately need extra prayers and monetary support. Even \$5/month will help feed a family of four for a whole week!

<u>Pakistan: How you provided Christmas gifts to a</u> <u>whole parish</u>

Here's a letter for you from Fr. Joseph Farooq, head of the ROCOR mission in Pakistan:

In Pakistan, Christians get very rare opportunities to celebrate social events together. So our church provides them an opportunity for their spiritual growth and strengthening their faith; this also a chance to share joy and happiness and to eat good food.

Our women's group at the Saint Matrona Adult Education and Sewing Center and the Youth of Saint Michael the Archangel prepared food for 400 of the faithful. It was a very blessed time for all of us.

<u>Ukrainian Christians persevere in the face of</u> <u>humiliations, slander, and attacks</u>

Did you know that the Ukrainian government officially canceled Old Calendar Nativity and Theophany? The whole might of the propaganda machine came crashing down on the canonical Ukrainian Orthodox Church.

Here's what our sources in Ukraine tell us.

There were numerous announcements in the media warning Christians that the **Old Calendar had been** canceled(!).

Worse yet, a new rule requires members of the canonical Church to physically destroy(!) the churches they have built themselves if something is wrong with the documents. And there's pretty much always something wrong.

The big historical churches which were confiscated and given to the noncanonical church are empty.

The faithful gather in private houses or apartments, trying to be quiet.

In Lvov, the faithful started gathering at the priest's house (which he legally owns) after the confiscation of their church, but a mob broke the fence and the door, trying to scare people away.

But not all news is bad.

Although persecuted, the faithful keep cheerful and try to do some good to their people. Thanks to your help, humanitarian aid was delivered to several regions, hundreds of people have received hot meals and humanitarian packs, and over 500 children received Christmas presents and school bags.

"You are the only ones who are helping us. The Red Cross is not helping, the government is not helping," said our contact in the canonical Ukrainian Orthodox Church.

Please pray for them and continue to support them when their own government is trying to destroy them – just like the Soviet government did 100 years ago...

ROCOR church musicians receive much needed help – thanks to you. <u>Here's How You Keep ROCOR Music Alive</u>

So much of the beauty and theology of Holy Orthodoxy is found in its hymnody, and a good choir can truly transport worshippers from earth to Heaven. That's why kind donors like you have generously supported choir work.

In 2023, donors like you – who care deeply about keeping up the ROCOR musical tradition – have supported a total of *three choral training events:*

- A choir conference in Ottawa, featuring multiple lectures on the musical heritage of Rachmaninoff and all things choral singing, including a conducting masterclass by Dr. Vladimir Morosan, Founder and President of Musica Russica;

- An intense two weeks of a choral conducting program in Nanuet, New York, led by the Summer School of Liturgical Music, where students took classes in Church Slavonic, Typicon, Church Music History, Liturgical Performance, Practice, Music Theory, Sight Singing, Choral Methods, and Voice;

- A laser-focused choral/conductor training program in Staten Island, New York, led by Maestro Vladimir Gorbik, focusing on developing Orthodox sound and correct diction, as well as conducting technique and correct hand articulation for directing any part of the divine services, including conducting the tones. Thanks to you, several dozen ROCOR church musicians have benefitted from these choral events.

They came away with more knowledge and skills, as well as having made friends and joined a support network. They went back to their choirs invigorated and ready to serve the Lord – and their parishes – better.
